COURSE OVERVIEW


Academic Year

Leadership Academy offers prospective students two academic-year tracks to choose from: General Leadership and Ministry Leadership. It is our hope that students will enroll in each one, respectively, though it is not required.


Each academic year is an eight (8)-month course of study. Each year runs late August through May, congruent with standard academic calendars. December we take a break for the holidays.




Leadership Academy Elements

Reading List and Reports

Essential to every endeavor in today's learning environment is reading. Few books are the end-all-be-all; however, authors' views, experiences and advice offer great springboards from which to dive into any topic.

Leadership Academy has developed a reading a list directly related to monthly Webinar topics. Each book has been chosen to preface the Webinar content and lay the groundwork upon which the next month's builds. Prior to webinars, students will complete and submit a basic report that summarizes the assigned book's contents and what the student is taking away from each. (see SAMPLE report included).



Completing and submitting the reports back to the Region office on time is essential (also addressed under "Monthly Webinars" below).

Monthly Webinars

Also essential in today's learning environment is the opportunity to discuss, question and evaluate the content presented in the monthly readings. The 2016-2017 Webinars will differ from previous years. Dan Carlson, a recently addition to the Mountain Plains Open Bible ministry team, will facilitate each webinar discussion, share supplemental content, field questions and provide additional insights and moments of candor concerning the selected topics.

In order to receive webinars' access codes, students MUST submit the required monthly book report back to the Regional Office on time. Upon receiving reports, the regional office will send the code via email to respective students.



Webinars will last up to 60 minutes and will include both presentation elements provided by the facilitator, along with time for questions and discussion of the content. Please make careful note of each month's webinar date and mark your calendar!

For those whose schedules experience emergencies and make attendance impossible, Webinars will be "banked" to be viewed at students' convenience. Though students will not be able to ask questions of presenters, this is a helpful feature for students experiencing last-minute schedule challenges.

Final Project

1. Prepare a research paper on one of the offered ministry topics.
2. Select an individual who serves in the area you chose, then interview them.
3. Select your own book; submit report per the regular book report form.
4. Submit a minimum 1,500-word research paper to Leadership Academy administrative office by June 30, 2016.

Schedule & Tuition Information: Regular and Selective Enrollment

Regular Enrollment

For regular enrollment (all eight sessions), registration period is July 20 – August 20, 2016.

Note: There is no application fee for Leadership Academy!

Upon approval, enrollees will receive notice by email of their acceptance.

Tuition cost: \$200.00 per student and is due by August 24, 2016.

Selective Enrollment

Leadership Academy invites individuals and groups to attend webinars a la carte. Perhaps some of the months' topics are of particular interest to individuals and/or leadership teams. If so, individuals and groups are encouraged to register with Leadership Academy by the 15th of the month in order to receive an access code for that month's webinar. Webinar attendance *fees will be:

Individuals: \$30.00

3-4 people: \$75.00

5+ people: \$100.00

Access codes for select webinars will be sent from the regional office to registered individuals and groups 1-2 days in advance.

In order to receive an access code to the Leadership Academy Orientation webinar scheduled for Thursday, August 25, 2016, tuition must be paid in full.

What Tuition Covers: Regular and Selective Enrollment

Regular Enrollment

Prospective enrollees may wonder: What will I receive in return for my \$200 investment?

Tuition in Leadership Academy defrays the costs to Mountain Plains Region of Open Bible Churches, Inc. for the following:

The costs to purchase and ship each book;

The cost of the webinar service;

Presenters' honorariums;

Administrative fees related to processing and mailing completion certificates.



Selective Enrollment

The webinar registration fee gains one or a group's full access to the presentation including the Q&A session at the end of each webinar. During Q&A, an individual or individual representing a group will be able to submit questions via the "Questions" feature provided by the online service Leadership Academy employs.

The value that each participant will receive from the collective knowledge, wisdom, and insights of each Webinar is worth many times the cost of tuition or webinar registration.

REQUIREMENTS & COVENANT FOR REGULAR ENROLLEES

Personal Requirements

Student Age

Leadership Academy is designed to address pertinent topics for emerging leaders. Mountain Plains Region recognizes that sometimes leaders are emerging earlier in life while others emerge later.

With that, it is important to note there is absolutely no cap on an enrollee's age.

Important to note, however, is that Leadership Academy does have a minimum age requirement.

Participants must be 16 years of age by the beginning of the Academic Year (August 25, 2016).

Prospective enrollees who are 15 years old before the enrollment deadline, yet will turn 16 on or before August 25, 2015 are welcomed to apply.

Underage applicants are **REQUIRED** to have a parent's or legal guardian's signature on their enrollment form.

Enrollment Form and Student Covenant

Participants will submit the Leadership Academy enrollment form and indicate agreement with the Student Covenant by signature on or before the July 31, 2015 deadline.

Technological Requirements

Access

Participants must have access to the following to participate in Leadership Academy:

Computer – desktop, laptop or tablet - equipped with a webcam

High-speed Internet access, whether by line or wireless (Wi-Fi)

An email account (at which to receive notifications and electronic forms)

A physical address (for mailing books from the required monthly reading list)



Requirements for “Satisfactory Completion” of Leadership Academy

The following criteria must be met for an Academy participant to receive his/her completion certificate:

Submitting completed 6 of 8 Monthly Book Report forms

Attendance to 6 of 8 webinars.

Submission of Final Project (minimum 1,500 word research paper and related book report) to Region office by June 15, 2017.

A participant’s failure to meet the minimum requirements for satisfactory completion results in no Leadership Academy Certificate by Mountain Plains Region!

Leadership Academy Student Covenant

Relationship is a matter God has demonstrated His utmost interest in:

He instituted it in The Garden.

He continued it even after the fall of mankind into sin.

He declared it by proclamation with Abraham.

He defined it even more narrowly in setting the nation of Israel apart.

Today, He commends His value of relationship in that, while we were yet sinners, God’s only begotten Son, Jesus, died for us, taking upon Himself the due penalty of our sinfulness and making a way for us to enjoy an eternal covenant written in blood able to satisfy the wrath of God’s justice.

We owed a debt for sin we couldn’t possibly pay. God the Son paid the debt He didn’t owe. That’s how important relationship is to God: He made a way for His people to enjoy relationship with Him by covenant (I Corinthians 11:25).

We take the issue of covenant (promise) seriously, too.

We ask each Leadership Academy participant to abide by these promises:

Having been forgiven by God's great grace, baptized in His Name, which is Jesus Christ of Nazareth, and being in agreement with Leadership Academy statements, strategy and structure, I now feel led by the Holy Spirit to participate. In doing so, I commit myself to God, my home church’s leaders, the Academy facilitators and other students by doing the following:



I. I will protect the unity of my home church and Leadership Academy.

- A) By showing love and respect toward pastoral staff and leaders of my home church and to leaders and fellow students of Leadership Academy;
- B) By refusing to gossip;
- C) By continuing to faithfully attend, financially support and serve in an area or areas I desire or am needed in my home church;
- D) By committing to work through conflicts according to the biblical principles set forth in Matthew 18:15-20 for my integrity's sake, my home church's health, and the sake of Leadership Academy's effectualness.

"So then let us aim for harmony in the church and try to build each other up" (Romans 14:19).

"Now you can have sincere love for each other as brothers and sisters because you are cleansed from your sins when you accepted the truth of the Good News. So see to it that you really do love each other intensely with all your hearts" (I Peter 1: 22).

"Don't use foul or abusive language. But everything you say be good and helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear them" (Ephesians 4: 29).

"Obey your spiritual leaders and do what they say. Their work is to watch over your souls, and they know they are accountable to God. Give them reason to do this joyfully and not with sorrow. That would certainly not be for your benefit" (Hebrews 13:17).

"As for a person who stirs up division, after warning him once and then twice, have nothing more to do with him, knowing that such a person is warped and sinful; he is self-condemned" (Titus 3:10-11).

II. I will share the responsibility for my home church and Leadership Academy.

- A) By praying for my and other's growth on a daily basis;
- B) By demonstrating moral support of my church and working for her good;
- C) By being a good steward: participating in and completing in the required elements for satisfactory completion of the Academy in a timely manner.

"It is written to the church... we always thank God for all of you and pray for you constantly" (I Thessalonians 1:1-2).

"Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity" (Psalm 133:1).

"So accept each other just as Christ has accepted you; then God will be glorified" (Romans 15:7).

"Then He said to them all, 'If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me'" (Luke 9:23).



“Work willingly at whatever you do, as though you were working for the Lord rather than for people” (Colossians 3:23).

III. I will support the testimony of my home church and Leadership Academy

- A) By faithfully attending and remaining a part of my home church;
- B) By living a godly life in accordance with the biblical standards holiness set forth below;
- C) By supporting my home church through regularly giving tithes tithing and offerings.

"And let us not neglect our meeting together... but encourage and worn each other" (Hebrews 10:25).

"Whatever happens... you must live in a manner worthy of the good news about Christ, and citizens of Heaven" (Philippians 1: 27).
